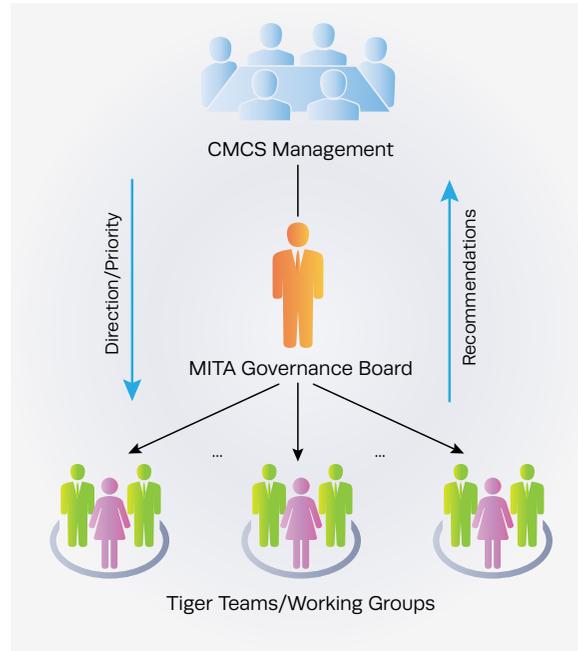

MITA Purpose, Need for Governance & Governance Benefits

Medicaid Information Technology Architecture (MITA) is a common business, technical, and information architecture framework that:

- Provides states and vendors guidance in support of Medicaid Enterprise Systems (MES) implementation
- Helps CMS evaluate states' MES maturity levels

Governance is needed to:

- Provide timely prioritized updates to the MITA Framework
- Ensure that MITA Framework is current, reflects new legislative mandates, emerging technologies, standards, and states' evolving needs
- Incorporate stakeholder perspectives throughout the MES ecosystem

Governance Benefits:

- Provides support and traction to continue and grow CMCS' MITA Initiative
- Facilitates and prioritizes MITA Framework enhancements and ensure that changes are implementable
- Recommendations on architecture represent the interests of multiple stakeholders

Governance Scope

MITA Governance activities will help:

- Prioritize, raise awareness, and address MITA Framework opportunities
- Provide technical approaches to align with the architectures, identify improvements, and make individual operational recommendations
- Review and propose MITA glossaries and vocabularies
- Review and provide guidance to stakeholders on using the MITA architectures, guidance, and technical standards, etc.
- Coordinate MITA with other Medicaid initiatives and processes

MITA Governance will not:

- Develop or issue policies
- Define policy meanings
- Develop standards
